Program Details

- 12 hour certificate program designed for students considering careers in the nonprofit community sector, those interested in developing their leadership capacity, and students generally interested in community service and public life.
- The certificate is cost-competitive with other regional universities. There is no additional cost to UD undergraduate students and a minimal cost for UD graduate students.
- Open to all UD undergraduate students (with junior standing or completion of 60 credit hours at the time of registration)

NPCL Certificate Courses

Admission Requirements

- University of Dayton undergraduates may apply upon attaining junior standing (60 semester hours) with a minimum 3.0 GPA.
- University of Dayton graduate students may apply at any time during their degree program provided they possess a minimum 3.0 GPA.
- Certificate-only students must have successfully completed a baccalaureate degree, and attained an undergraduate cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher. Applicants who have less than a 2.75 cumulative GPA may be admitted after an interview with the certificate coordinator.
