

2020-2021 ANNUAL REPORT

COUNSELING STUDENT FEEDBACK

Clinical Mental Health Counseling and School Counseling students provided feedback on the counseling programs. General themes from the feedback and department responses are summarized below.

- The student course evaluations of all adjunct instructors are reviewed each semester, and feedback for improvement is provided.
- The Behavioral Health Workforce and Education and Training Program provides a stipend, clinical training, and educational experiences with community partners for a culturally diverse team of school and clinical mental health counseling students.

FEEDBACK FROM SCHOOL COUNSELING STUDENTS

In response to student feedback, the following curricular changes were made:

- Classroom management has been added to EDC 599-Internship in School Counseling.
- The ASCA standards have been infused into the current curricular program.
- An advisory committee comprised of practicing school counseling, graduate students, and SEL coordinators from Dayton and Dublin has been formed to review changes.

NEW INITIATIVES IN CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING

Ecotherapy Certificate

An Ecotherapy certificate is being developed which will consist of 10 hours within the existing CMHC program (including elective courses in Ecotherapy, Holistic Wellness, and Adventure Counseling). Students can choose this micro concentration to supplement their interest in this topic.

Interprofessional Education Certificate

An Interprofessional Education (IPE) certificate is being discussed which will highlight the growing trend toward cross-disciplinary practice. These electives would coincide with the ongoing bi-annual IPE symposiums which bring together students in multiple health care professions across 4 universities for case study and collaboration.

Sexual Issues in Clinical Treatment course

An elective in Sexual issues in counseling was offered during the Spring 2022.
