

# Spring Break Housing FAQ

**I have paid for the Spring semester and Spring Break is included in this fee. Why do I have to leave housing?**

Students are billed for housing on a per semester basis and not a daily rate. The University decided housing would be closed for students during Spring Break in order to create a safer environment for them.

**I have heard that the University will be securing all spaces over Spring Break, what does this mean?**

Only a select few University personnel will be able to access student residences during Spring Break. We will grant students access only if necessary.

**How was the limit of 400 miles determined?**

We determined this based on the number of people the University could support during Spring Break.

**I cannot return to my permanent residence or there has been a change in my family circumstances that makes leaving campus difficult. Can I remain in my University Housing?**

**I live more than 400 miles away; can I be in my University Housing during part of the week?**

If you live more than 400 miles away, you are permitted to remain in University Housing. Once you've been approved for Spring Break Housing by submitting an application, you are free to leave and return to the University or your assigned residential space as you wish.

**If I am eligible to stay in University Housing over spring break, is there an additional charge?**

**I live in a residence hall. Will I be permitted to remain in my room over break?**

No. Students who live in traditional residence halls who meet one or more of the criteria for requesting to stay in University housing over the break will be assigned a temporary location in a guest house, apartment, or CARE space during the break.
