Overview

The Graduate Assistant for Advocacy and Intervention in the Dean of Students Office is responsible for coordinating, maintaining, and documenting intervention for student concerns and referrals from the campus community and providing outreach programming to students. The position is part-time (20 hours per week/10 months) and is supervised by the Assistant Dean of Students for Advocacy and Intervention.

Responsibilities

- Triage and review concerns and referrals about students wellbeing and coordinate intervention as appropriate
- Assist and advocate for students experiencing crises. This includes working with students directly as well as consulting with faculty and staff colleagues to assist them in managing student crises.
- Coordinate efforts in food and housing insecurity initiatives.
- Collect facts pertaining to students of concern and maintain accurate case records. Provide aggregate data about trends to various stakeholders.
- Develop, implement, and evaluate programs to promote student of concern services and educate the campus community.
